I am still ~~very~~ <sup>very</sup> concerned ~~with~~ <sup>about</sup> the Bartley paper. Since it would obviously go into '1. The Critical Approach to Philosophy', it would become, for alphabetical reasons, the first paper; and this would be excellent, because it is ever so much better than Eccles' paper (which he has sent me, and which I found very disappointing<sup>§</sup>; but this, of course, is confidential!). I have had no reply, so far, to my previous appeals to you concerning Bartley - no doubt, because it is too early for a reply. So let ~~me~~ <sup>us</sup> ~~ask~~ <sup>implore</sup> you again to do your best for him! (He is rather depressed about the matter.)

You mentioned in a previous letter 29 papers (without Bartley). But the list you sent shows only 28. Moreover, you mentioned Bernays who is not in the list, however. Has he withdrawn?

There is another point: Should you not insert, before 5 (The Writings of ----), a list, or rather a <sup>brief</sup> Who is Who, of the contributors? This is customary in U.S. publications; and it is particularly necessary in an inter-national and inter-departmental ~~under~~ enterprise like this. Many thanks, yours ever
