Herbert Feigl told me in Vienna that The Critical Approach was out, and that he had actually seen a copy; and on our last day in Vienna a copy actually arrived! It is a beautiful volume; and although I have only read in it, looking at various places, I can say with confidence that it is a very good book - much better than any Festschrift I have ever seen. (I do not even exclude the most famous of them all - the Zeller Festschrift to which Helmholtz and Theodor Gouperz and other Heroes of Old contributed.) Although I was, partly by yourself and partly by Feigl, prepared to expect something very good, I was nevertheless very much surprized by the beauty as well as by the extraordinary high standard of the contributions; and your own Introductory Remarks came as a surprize to me and to Henric. They are much too eclogistic; still, they are very well meant, and gratefully (and shamefacedly) received by both of us.

As to the change on the cover and title page which gave you some headache, as I remember, I for one am all on the side of the publisher! At any rate, I feel that another way of putting it would have been even more embarrassing! In my opinion everything is perfect as it is, and I am very greatly honoured and very much pleased with it. It is a wonderful gift, and should finally free me from every ambition I might still have harboured so far!

Vienna was very strenuous but very interesting and worth while. Before returning to our Island, Penn, we are having a short holiday in a little village in the mountains (not the high Mountains) of Salzburg. On Monday July 13th we intend to be back home.
