Many thanks for your letters of April 11, 13, and for
the page proofs! (of pages 33 to 44.)

(1) As to the page proofs, it seems that the Printers sent you
mine, and me yours, mixing up the envelopes; for today
I received from them an envelope with pp 97 to 117,
containing Prof. Ludwig's and your contributions. I am sen-
ding them to you at once.

You will have seen, from the Photocopy of pp. 33 to 44 which I
sent you meanwhile, that I corrected them, photocopied them,
and sent them off to Heidelberg and Montreal, all on the
same day I received them! Thus please cease your insinuating
references to my poor Postscript!!! ("Sorry to mention this ^{sore} point
but I won't let go so easily." I can say so as well as you!)

(2) About University Administrators I concur with you very much indeed.

(3) I personally should not advise you to accept Berlin: if you don't get
your Institute in Montreal, it will have to be in the U.S.; and it will make
this plan more difficult if you move too much about: they won't give you
easily an Institute if they fear that you won't stay - that you move
about without sufficient reason! And although I sympathize with your
love for Europe, your ancestors did well to leave Germany.

(4) Love to Marta: she need not hurry in writing to me about Category Theory:
though I should like to know what it is all about - the problem - I am simply
frightfully busy (this is why I rushed the proofs: it was now or never!), and I won't
die of boredom if I hear of it a little later.

(5) Scientific Research: it looks wonderful, but I won't be able to read it properly for some
time. Please accept this as not an apology, but as truth! (I am working to 3 a.m.)

(6) I read of course your Turn of the Tide, and liked it. I suppose you won't like
to add anything; but in view of your mentioning of Cassirer, would you not put
the dates of Heyesson, Cassirer, and Popper in - perhaps in the References? Not that
it is important.

(7) I am sending on your Nominations to the Academy; but I rather should prefer not to be too deeply
involved with it.
